The development of the following national patient registries for organ transplantations:

- (i) Living Paired Donor Exchange,***
- (ii) Urgent Status Patients, and***
- (iii) Highly Sensitised Patients***

and related databases for such things as performance measurement.

NATIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEES

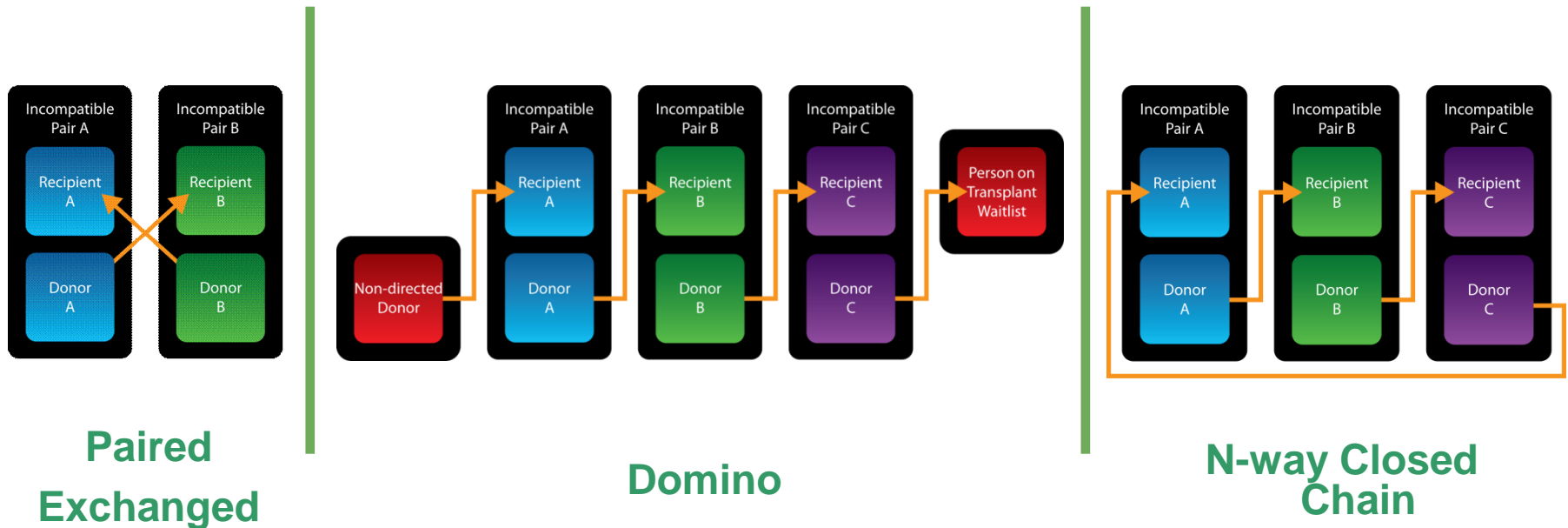
The following committees are made up of subject matter experts from across the country:

NATIONAL ORGAN REGISTRIES

Living Donor Paired Exchange (LDPE)

- Finds exchanges for recipients with incompatible living donors
- Launched in 2009; 144 kidney transplants to date (Sept., 2012)



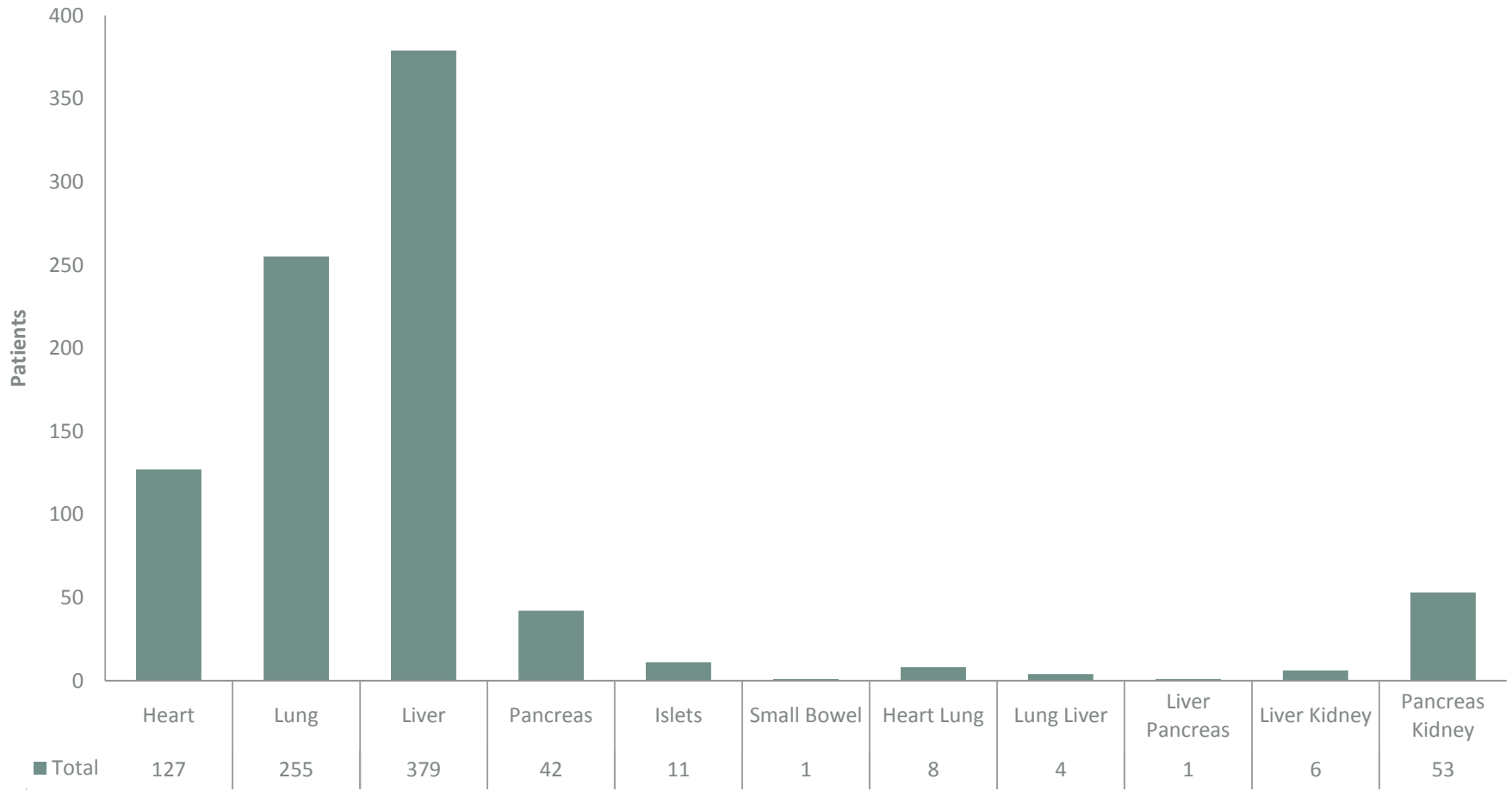
NATIONAL ORGAN REGISTRIES

National Organ Waitlist (NOW)

- The national list of non-renal patients waiting for organ transplants in Canada
- Live on June 26, 2012.

Active Non-Renal Patients by Organ Type

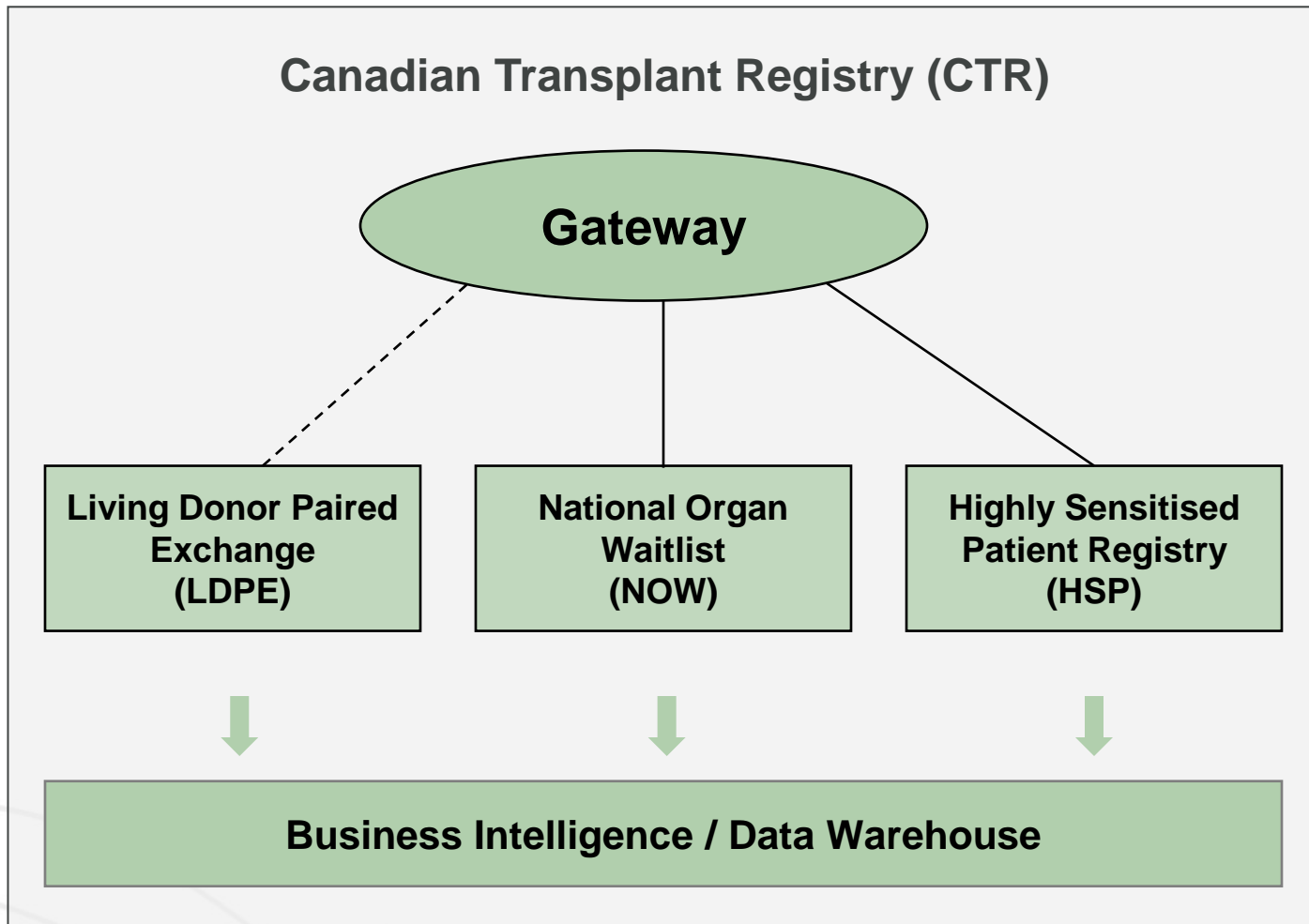


NATIONAL ORGAN REGISTRIES

Highly Sensitised Patient (HSP) Registry

- Will introduce inter-provincial sharing of kidneys for highly sensitized patients; agreement in place, but a registry is required to make it happen.
- Highly sensitised patients are disadvantaged in terms of equitable access to deceased donor organs.
- To be considered highly sensitised in this registry, the recipient must have a PRA of 95%, or higher.
- While the focus is on the HSP kidneys, the registry is designed for all organs.
- Target is Q1 2013.
